A motion was made by Gary Hadden and seconded by William Klein to adopt Ordinance #2018-3 approving the certificate of termination of the Ontelaunee Township Municipal Authority. Vote 3:0

A motion was made by William Klein and seconded by Gary Hadden to hire Kelly Burdick as a parttime Secretary for Ontelaunee Township at a rate of \$24.50 per hour. Vote 3:0

A motion was made by Gary Hadden and seconded by William Klein to approve moving the hydrant at Huller Lane and Koch Road. This hydrant was hit several times the latest being by a tractor trailer in February. The approximate cost will be \$4,210 with \$2,500 being reimbursed by the insurance company. Vote 3:0

A motion was made by Gary Hadden and seconded by William Klein to approve the proposal from Comfort Pro to repair the compressor and heat pump for the HVAC system at a cost of \$5,989.00. Vote 3:0
