All dogs must be restrained on any street or sidewalk.



While mowing your lawn, no grass clippings or garden waste shall be deposited on any public property, sidewalk or street. This is a violation of our ordinance and is hazardous to motorcycle drivers, it is like driving on ice. In addition, the grass flows into the storm drains when it rains and creates back up of the drains.



## **Recycling information**



Ontelaunee Township offers free Single Stream Recycling to our residents. Single Stream Recycling allows participants to place their recyclables in one container without sorting or separate bins.

The single stream dumpsters is located behind the Township Building. Residents are welcome to drop their recyclables from dawn to dusk seven days a week. The area is monitored by security cameras. The Township does not provide pick-up or recycling containers.

Acceptable: Aluminum cans, glass food & beverage containers (brown, green & clear), plastics (#1 thru #7), paper and cardboard. - In order to use all the space in the dumpster please smash or crush your plastic and cardboard.

#### **Not Acceptable:**

Pots, pans, aluminum foil, ceramic oven-ware, drinking glasses, window glass, mirror glass, light bulbs, Styrofoam, clay pots, plastic bags, foil type paper, paper towels, tissue paper.

<u>Yard Waste</u> - grass clippings, tree, shrubbery clippings may be taken to Berks Soil and Stone at 1 Belleman's Church Road, Leesport for recycling. Phone number is: 484-277-7901

## Building/Zoning/Code Enforcement Township Zoning Officer hours: Monday and Wednesdays – 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.



As the warm weather approaches and we begin to consider summer backyard projects please be reminded that the Uniformed Construction Code (section 403.62) states <u>ANY/ALL</u> prefabricated swimming pools greater than twenty-four (24) inches in height require a Building Permit to be issued. Additionally, a Certificate of Occupancy must be obtained by the home owner <u>prior to the use of the pool</u>.

These requirements are for <u>ANY/ALL</u> swimming pools regardless of whether they are purchased from a big box store or installed by a pool contractor.

Other examples of projects that need permits:

Deck, patios, fences, retaining walls, driveway extensions, sheds, electrical and plumbing work just to name a few if you are not sure, give the office a call to determine if a permit is needed.

Permits are available either at the Township Building or at <a href="www.kraftmunicipalgroup.com">www.kraftmunicipalgroup.com</a>. Once completed, the permit application should be submitted to the Township building along with the required non-refundable application fee of \$50 for residential applications and \$150 for commercial

Please remember that the keeping of chickens or other fowl is not permitted in the township unless the property has two acres.





## What is Stormwater?

In Pennsylvania, we get an average of 41 inches of precipitation each year. When it rains or the snow melts, where does this water go? In more natural areas, water is quickly able to infiltrate into the ground. A forested area allows for about 18 inches per hour of infiltration, where an average lawn allows for about 2 inches per hour.

Impervious surfaces like pavement and rooftops, offer no infiltration at all. All of the water that doesn't infiltrate flows over the ground, over roofs and through gutters on buildings, into storm drains, and into the nearest waterway –our lakes, rivers, and streams. This is stormwater.

Stormwater can be the water running out of the gutters on your home or garage, and down your driveway. If a home has 2,000 square feet of impervious surfaces, that is equal to 1,246 gallons of stormwater runoff that need to be managed during a typical rainstorm. That's a lot of water that needs somewhere to go! Stormwater can also be the water rushing across a farm field, over a highway, through a parking lot, or through a construction site. It's important to be aware of stormwater, where it comes from, and where it goes because it impacts water quality in your local watershed. Flooding, pollutants, erosion, and property damage can all result from uncontrolled stormwater runoff.

There are local ordinances and regulations for the control of stormwater runoff in your municipality. These ordinances determine the best ways to manage stormwater for the benefit of local residents and businesses, as well as for the overall health of the watershed. Homeowners, businesses and industries can all work together with municipalities to help manage stormwater and its potential impacts. Understanding stormwater is the first step to making good choices and being a good neighbor in your watershed.

number visible from the street. Help emergency personnel and postal workers by updating the street numbers on your mailbox.





It is your responsibility to keep the area to, in, and around your meter pit free of obstacles and encumbrances to permit safe and speedy access to the meter. As warmer weather approaches and you begin landscaping, do not cover the meter pit lid with rocks, mulch, flowers, etc.



## **Road Construction**

The Township has been notified by PA DOT that there will be road construction on the following roads in April or May:

Leesport Avenue from Snyder to West Huller &
Cider Mill from Kindt Corner to
Shoemakersville Road

In addition, the township has awarded a bid for repairs to the sewer pump stations. One of the pump stations on Gernants' Church road is set for construction this summer. Please be aware there may be road closures and/or delays on Gernant's Church Road while the construction is going on.
