### **Recycling information**

Ontelaunee Township offers free Single Stream Recycling to our residents. Single Stream Recycling allows participants to place their recyclables in one container without sorting or separate bins.



The single stream dumpster is located at the Township Building. Residents are welcome to drop their recyclables from dawn to dusk seven days a week. The area is monitored by security cameras. The Township does not provide pick-up or recycling containers.

### Acceptable:

Aluminum cans, glass food & beverage containers (brown, green & clear), plastics (#1 thru #7), paper and cardboard. - In order to use all the space in the dumpster please smash or crush your plastic and cardboard.

#### Not Acceptable:

Pots, pans, aluminum foil, ceramic oven-ware, drinking glasses, window glass, mirror glass, light bulbs, Styrofoam, clay pots, plastic bags, foil type paper, paper towels, tissue paper.

### WINTER WEATHER COMING SOON

Before you know it the first snowflakes will be falling. You need to be prepared for any type of winter weather, snow, sleet, freezing rain, etc. The road crews whether it be a Pa Dot driver or a township driver, they all need your patience and assistance during any snow or ice event.

Please remove the vehicles from the street to give the driver ample room to maneuver the plow. If possible wait until the road has been plowed before clearing your driveway. There is no way to prevent snow from being pushed into driveways; however, shoveling snow to the right side of the driveway will minimize the amount of snow pushed back into the driveway by the plow. Please do not put any snow back onto plowed roadways.

All major thoroughfares will be done first. After the initial pass, the plow will return to widen the path.

Ida Red Drive from its intersection with Fuji Drive, located in the Harvest Subdivision, and continuing through the McIntosh Farms II Subdivision to the end of the curbed portion of Ida Red Road being located at the eastern end of the McIntosh Farms II Subdivision.

### **Sunglo Drive (entire length)**



The township supervisors are asking all residents with a fire hydrant in front of or on their property to **adopt the hydrant** during the winter months. Please shovel any snow that may accumulate around the hydrant. In a fire situation, seconds count and if the firefighters cannot find the hydrant or have to dig it out the lost time could result in catastrophic damage to your or your neighbor's home.

Prevent street flooding by clearing catch basins near your home to allow rain and melting snow to enter the drainage system.

All snow plows are angled the same way (to the driver's right) and will automatically push the snow that direction. It is impossible for the equipment operators to avoid pushing snow into cleared driveways and sidewalks. If you must clear your driveway prior to the completion of snow plowing, please keep in mind that the snow that is in front of the plow will unload wherever there is a cleared area. This is why snow is left in a cleared driveway as the street is plowed. Clearing an area on the side of the driveway from which the plow approaches will provide an area for the snow to unload before it reaches your driveway. This area needs to be at least five feet long and two to three feet wide.



#### It is unlawful to shovel, plow or snowblow any snow into the street or roadway.

Any property owner/tenant of every property fronting any street in the township is asked to remove from the sidewalks all snow or ice that has fallen within 24 hours after any snow event. Please have a path of 36 inches wide cleared.

Mailbox damage- the township is not responsible for any mailboxes that are located within the right of way, that are hit by snow, ice or snowplows.

As we approach another autumn, there are a few things that we feel important to bring to your attention. If you need to make a report or to see a Police Officer, please call the non-emergency Dispatch number at (610)655-4911. Calling the office directly is like calling the hospital because you need an ambulance. While our Officers do work out of our office, they are usually out patrolling the streets. Obviously if it's an emergency, call 911 right away.

Thefts from vehicles have declined, so it is apparent that people have followed our advice and stopped leaving valuables in their cars.

We are excited to be replacing two old patrol vehicles with new vehicles, and they should be on the street as you read this. We're also hiring two new Officers, and promoting two Officers which will further help our Police Department become more effective.

As school once again starts, please watch for students and school buses before and after class.

We routinely get complaints about speeders in the various developments. Please know your complaints are being heard, and it's frustrating for us as well. Often our Officers will be assigned to an area to monitor traffic, but will be called away for another important call. We cannot have an Officer dedicated to speed timing in every development for an entire shift.

### **STORMWATER NEWS**



You may have noticed these markers on the storm drains. The Public Works crew placed storm drain medallions on the storm drains to help raise the community's awareness of pollution and reduce illicit discharge into drains. Pollution results from everyday activities and those pollutants are often swept directly into storm drains and waterways with stormwater runoff. Some examples include fertilizers, motor oil, litter and animal waste.

### **Winter Time Pollution Prevention**

Water pollution and conservation are important issues during the spring and summer months; however, there are many things that we can do during the winter months that will help reduce water pollution and help conserve water. Below are several tips on how to make a difference this winter:


#### Too Much Salt

When the snow and ice melt after a winter storm, the water flow will take with it anything that it collects on the ground and wash it down storm drains. This means that melting ice will carry the deicer materials that we use to clear our driveways and walkways down storm drains and into local waterways. The chlorides that make up the deicers can harm aquatic wildlife, affect nearby plant growth in your yard, and can remain trapped in your soils. Luckily there are alternatives to conventional rock salt deicers that are easy to purchase and will also help in keeping our pathways safe! Here are some helpful tips that will keep your pavements clear and local streams cleaner!

- Removing freshly fallen snow before it has a chance to freeze and harden into ice is one of the more effective ways of keeping your pavements clear. Deicers work better when there is only a thin layer of ice or snow.
- If you are using traditional rock salt, the recommended application is a *handful for one square yard*. Using more salt than this will not make the ice melt faster; it will only end up costing you more money and the salt will be washed away by the stormwater.
- Pay attention to the type of deicer material your applying so that you reduce the risk of damaging your sidewalk and driveway.
- Mixing sand in with the deicer will also aid in melting the snow and ice and allow you to cut back on the amount of rock salt that is being used. Sand and regular brand kitty litter will also add traction to the surface as well But remember, if there is left over sand and kitty litter on your walkway or driveway, then use a broom to clean it up
